

CALL NIGHT RULES AND PROCEDURES

All Students:

- You must work four nights of call with the trauma team.
- Other services you rotate on may ask you to take call; these nights do NOT count toward your four trauma call nights. You are not required to take call on other services.
- The resident or attending on trauma must sign for each night individually on your COSPRO.
- Do NOT go home. When you are on call, you are to stay at the hospital the entire night (Usually 6pm-6am).
- Check with your individual service to find out what is expected of you. On the day after call, they must let you go home, post call, by noon. (Do not work more than 30 consecutive hours.)
- If you cannot make a call night, you must let me know. No shows will be documented.
- Do not show up for a call night if you have not signed-up for it. Only two students may be on call for any given night.
- On your first call night, let the resident know it is your first night and s/he will explain what is expected of you.
- You may take only one night of call while on your subspecialty unless it is a Friday or Saturday
- Weekend call (Sat/Sun) is 24 hours.....round with your team, then report to trauma. (6am-6am)
- Because of the 80-hour policy, you must have 5 or 6 days in between each call night.

Gainesville:

-The trauma team rounds at 6:00pm on 10-5 (the 10th floor of the hospital. Please arrive there by 6:00pm to round with the team. Please ask at the nurse's station on the 10th floor where 10-5 is located.

-Call (Sleeping) Rooms:

-Student lounge, 4192 (code: 5-3-1)

Jacksonville:

- Jacksonville students may take call at Jacksonville, but it must be on trauma.
- Check with either your chief resident or Heidi Weschler to let them know when you would like to take call
- You may split up your call nights any way you choose.
